<b>Summary of PPG spending 2015-16</b>
<p><b>Objectives in spending PPG:</b></p> <p>To ensure that throughout each year group and across the curriculum, including in English and mathematics, eligible pupils make substantial and sustained progress, developing excellent knowledge and understanding, considering their different starting points. To ensure that the progress of eligible pupils from different starting points matches or is improving towards that of other non eligible pupils nationally.</p>
<p><b>Nature of Support:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Flash Maths daily maths to support rapid recall</li> <li>• PSA worker to support PPG pupils by providing nurture group and one-to-one sessions</li> <li>• 1-1 support from English specialist for two pupils</li> <li>• Small group intervention delivered by English specialist</li> <li>• Additional time for TA intervention preparation</li> </ul>

- Subsidising of school trips
- Subsidising attendance at home learning club
- Parental engagement activities including priority for parent evening appointments, phone consultation with parents, parent volunteers in the classroom, class assemblies, Friday assemblies, Macmillan French cafe, maths workshop for parents, open classrooms for parents, grandparent afternoon in Reception
- Chipping Norton partnership work with HTs on PP

#### Monitoring the Impact of Pupil Premium Spending:

The governing body evaluate the impact of spending on each pupil throughout the year and at the end of the year. Evaluation focuses on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention. During the 2015-16 academic year, there were 4 children eligible for PPG (though funding only received for 2).

With small numbers of children concerned it is necessary to protect the anonymity of individual children.

To summarise the impact of 2015-16 spending, strategies to develop engagement and support achievement in reading and writing have been successful. Priority will be given in 2016-17 to targeting PPG grant towards raising progress in maths for targeted children.
